**SUBJECT:** MILMOD Vision requirements

**TO:** All Operations/MEPS Personnel

1. A defect has been identified in how MILMOD views the vision requirements during a seat match.
  - Currently, if a LNCO enters "Yes" to the "wears glasses or contacts" question in AFRISS, MILMOD will then expose the uncorrected and corrected vision entries in AFRISS to validate requirements for the AFSC.
  - If a LNCO enters "No" to the "wears glasses and contacts" question, MILMOD will not expose the uncorrected and corrected vision entries. This essentially means that MILMOD will reserve an applicant an AFSC that they may not qualify for if the applicant has less than 20/20 vision.
2. Until this defect is corrected, MEPS and OPS must follow these instructions:
  - When an applicant's vision is other than 20/20 uncorrected, you must enter in AFRISS that the applicant does wear glasses or contacts, even if they don't.
  - Do a manual check of the applicant's vision against the pre-requisite in MILMOD before notifying the applicant that they have reserved the AFSC. Pay close attention to follow-up QCs as well when it comes to AFSC vision requirements.
3. The new code to correct this problem in MILMOD is in progress and you will be notified when the update takes place.
